AHEPA SCHOLARSHIP: APPLICATION FOR HELLENIC STUDIES IN MANITOBA

The **Kleovoulos** Scholarship for Hellenic Studies covered by this application is worth \$2,500. It is named after philosopher Kleonoulos (also Cleobulus; Κλεόβουλος) of Rhodes, one of the 7 Sages or wise men (7 Σοφοί) of Ancient Hellas. «Παν μέτρον ἄριστον» or “Everything is best in moderation” is one of his famous sayings. The scholarship is sponsored by Paul Kostas of Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada, who hails originally from Rhodes. More information about AHEPA in Canada at the website: www.ahepacanada.org.

Please see specific qualifications on page 2 and make sure you meet all requirements and provide all documents. All submitted documents will be treated confidentially. You may be awarded this scholarship only once. The scholarship is awarded at the annual Banquet to honor “October 28th1940” (OXI Day), organized yearly by AHEPA in Winnipeg at the end of October. A non-transferable complimentary ticket will be reserved for this Banquet for each applicant. If you receive this scholarship you will not be notified ahead of time but your name will be announced at the Banquet; photographs may be taken and a recent photograph may be requested; your name, parts of your essay and photographs may be publicized with your permission.

QUALIFICATIONS: AHEPA SCHOLARSHIP FOR HELLENIC STUDIES IN MANITOBA

The **Kleovoulos** Scholarship for Hellenic Studies was established in 2008 to encourage students from Manitoba, Canada, The Hellenic Republic, Cyprus and other countries around the World to undertake undergraduate and graduate Hellenic Studies at any of the three Universities in Manitoba, Canada. The University of Manitoba (www.umanitoba.ca/faculties/arts/departments/classics/) has a Department of Classics, a Centre for Hellenic Civilization and St. Andrew's Orthodox College. The University of Winnipeg has a Classics Department (www.uwinnipeg.ca/index/classics-index), and Brandon University (www.brandonu.ca) offers relevant individual courses.

If in a particular year there are no qualified applicants, this scholarship may be offered to a qualified applicant for the AHEPA Kleovoulos Scholarship for Studies in Manitoba.

Required qualifications for scholarship applicants:

- a) Registration as a full-time student at a University in Manitoba as of September of the year the award is made. The student may be Canadian or not, of Hellenic Heritage or not, AHEPA Family member or not.
- b) Successful completion of at least 9 credit hours in any aspect of Hellenic Studies from pre-historic to modern times (language, literature, history, religion, orthodoxy, philosophy, archaeology, art, theater, architecture, mythology) from any accredited University; it is the applicant's responsibility to provide evidence of accreditation for non-Canadian educational institutions.
- c) Enrollment in the current academic year in at least 6 credit hours in Hellenic Studies.
- d) A minimum grade point average of B or equivalent (3.0 in many Universities) as calculated from official transcripts. **Please provide scale and details for your University grading system.**

Points will be awarded to select the successful applicant as follows:

1. Academic achievement will contribute points equivalent to the applicant's award grade point average (AGPA), expressed as a percentage. AGPA will be based on the average of all courses completed in the last academic year before applying (September to August).
2. University students who have completed more than 6 credit hours in Hellenic Studies within an academic year (September to August), an extra 4 points will be awarded for every 3 additional credit hours. Partial points may be obtained from courses that have 50% Hellenic content, provided it is certified by the course instructor.
3. A maximum 10 points will be awarded for an essay (maximum 2 typed pages) on **"The relevance of the Hellenic Civilization to the Modern World"**.
4. A maximum of 10 points will be awarded for leadership and volunteer activities; only non-paid activities with emphasis on last 3 years qualify.

Applicants must provide the following original documents or certified copies:

1. Official transcript of all courses completed and grades achieved in an accredited University, showing the grade system used and a certification statement by the instructor for courses with less than 100% content in Hellenic Studies.
2. Official registration forms for the current academic year in a Manitoba University.
3. A short essay on the relevance of the Hellenic Civilization in the Modern World.
4. Letters supporting leadership and volunteer activities certified by responsible persons (e.g. activity Chairpersons) indicating volunteer hours per activity.
5. A copy, certified by a University Professor, Priest, Chapter, District or National officer of an AHEPA Family Chapter, Lawyer, Notary Public, Medical Doctor, Professional Engineer or Certified/Chartered Accountant of any documents needed to prove status in Canada and date and place of birth (e.g. driver's license, relevant passport pages, birth certificate, permanent resident documents or landed immigrant card).
6. Social Insurance Number, if Canadian citizen or resident.
7. A statement of any competence or fluency in Greek, a list of scholarships or awards received (including any previous AHEPA scholarships), and a list of significant achievements, special talents, hobbies and interests.
