AHEPA SCHOLARSHIP: APPLICATION FOR STUDIES IN MANITOBA

The **Kleovoulos** Scholarship for Studies in Manitoba covered by this application is worth C\$2,000. It is named after philosopher Kleovoulos (also Cleobulus; Κλεόβουλος) of Rhodes, one of the 7 Sages or wise men (7 Σοφοί) of Ancient Hellas. «Παν μέτρον ἄριστον» or “Everything is best in moderation” is one of his famous sayings. The scholarship is sponsored by Paul Kostas of Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada, who hails originally from Rhodes. More information about AHEPA in Canada at the website: www.ahepacanada.org.

Please see specific qualifications on page 2 and make sure you meet all requirements and provide all documents. All submitted documents will be treated confidentially. You may be awarded this scholarship only once. The scholarship is awarded at the annual Banquet to honor “October 28th1940” (OXI Day), organized yearly by AHEPA in Winnipeg. A non-transferable complimentary ticket will be reserved for this Banquet for each applicant. If you receive this scholarship you will not be notified ahead of time but your name will be announced at the Banquet; photographs may be taken and a recent photograph may be requested; your name, parts of your essay and photographs may be publicized with your permission.

QUALIFICATIONS: AHEPA SCHOLARSHIP FOR STUDIES IN MANITOBA

The **Kleovoulos** Scholarship for Studies in Manitoba was established in 2009 to encourage students from any Canadian Province other than Manitoba or from the Hellenic Republic or from any other country around the World to undertake undergraduate and graduate Studies at any of the Universities in Manitoba, Canada. The scholarship is for students who are of Hellenic Heritage by birth or adoption through one parent or grandparent, as well as their spouses.

If in a particular year there are no qualified applicants, this scholarship may be offered to a qualified applicant for the AHEPA Kleovoulos Scholarship for Hellenic Studies.

Required qualifications for scholarship applicants:

- a) Registration as a full-time student at a University in Manitoba as of September of the year the award is made.
- b) A minimum grade point average (GPA) of a) 75% for High School graduates or b) B or equivalent (3.0 in many Universities) in a full academic session for undergraduate or graduate students. For undergraduate University or College students, a minimum of 24 credit hours completed in a single academic session (e.g. September to April) are also required. It is the applicant's responsibility to provide evidence of accreditation for non-Canadian educational institutions. **Please provide scale and details for your High School or University grading system.**

Points will be awarded to select the successful applicant as follows:

1. Academic achievement will contribute points equivalent to the applicant's grade point average (GPA), expressed as a percentage.
2. A maximum of 10 points will be awarded for an essay.
3. A maximum of 10 points will be awarded for leadership and volunteer activities; only non-paid activities with emphasis on last 3 years qualify.

Applicants must provide the following original documents or certified copies:

1. Official transcript of all courses completed and grades achieved in High School or accredited University.
2. Official registration forms for the current academic year in a Manitoba University.
3. An essay (maximum 2 typed pages) on "**The relevance of the Hellenic Civilization in the Modern World**".
4. Letters supporting leadership and volunteer activities certified by responsible persons (e.g. activity Chairpersons) indicating volunteer hours per activity.
5. A copy, certified by a University Professor, Priest, Chapter, District or National officer of an AHEPA Family Chapter, Lawyer, Notary Public, Medical Doctor, Professional Engineer or Certified/Chartered Accountant of any documents needed to prove citizenship, status in Canada, date and place of birth (e.g. driver's license, relevant passport pages, birth certificate, permanent resident documents or landed immigrant card).
6. Social Insurance Number, if Canadian citizen or resident.
7. A list of scholarships or awards received (including any previous AHEPA scholarships), and a list of significant achievements, special talents, hobbies and interests.
